

Nagawicka Lake Rules

Speed limits: 45mph – outside buoyed areas
10mph – ½ hr after sunset to ½ hr before sunrise
25mph – June, July, and August – Saturday, Sunday and holidays between 11am – 4pm

Slow No Wake (as slow as you can go and still maintain steerage of vessel) between buoys and shoreline and in channels.

All children less than 12 years of age must wear approved life preservers.

All boats are required to carry one wearable approved life preserver for each passenger on board. Boats 16 ft in length or more also must have an approved throwable PFD (life preserver) onboard.

Any vessel towing a water-skier or any other device has to have a competent observer in addition to the operator of the vessel.

Personal Watercraft (PWC) may tow a person as long as it is designed to carry three people and there is a competent observer in addition to the operator onboard.

Age restrictions (Boats)

- 10 & 11 year olds may operate only if accompanied by adult over 18 years of age
- 12 – 15 year olds may operate if accompanied by adult over 18 years of age or with a boating safety card from a course approved by the WI DNR (card must be carried at time of operation)
- A person born on or after 01/01/89 and 16 years old or older, may operate a boat only with a boating safety card from a course approved by the WI DNR (card must be carried at time of operation)

Age restrictions (PWC)

- No one under the age of 12 may operate a PWC
- A person born on or after 01/01/89 and 12 years old or older, may operate a PWC ONLY with a boating safety card from a course approved by the WI DNR (card must be carried at time of operation)

Batteries must be secured to the boat and both posts need to be covered.
