City of Delafield Residents Asked to Fine Tune Recycling

Veolia Environmental Services, which is contracted by the City of Delafield to pick up garbage and recyclables, would like to remind residents that recyclable materials must be separated from the trash and properly put in the recycling bins. Recyclables such as glass bottles, plastic containers marked with #1 or #2, and aluminum or tin cans, may be placed together in your recycling bin, but paper products such as newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper, cereal and snack boxes, beverage carriers, paper egg cartons, paper towel rolls, tissue boxes and paperback books should be contained in paper bags or tied in bundles, and placed on top of commingled recyclables. Corrugated cardboard must be flattened, cut in pieces no larger than 3'x4'x10", and bundled. Bundles of cardboard must be placed on top of commingled recyclables. Please do not dispose of recyclable materials in plastic bags. Also, Veolia would like to remind residents that grass and leaves are not included to be pickup up.

Please be advised that if the above guidelines are not followed, the bin will be tagged with a notice that the materials will not be picked up until they are properly put in the bin to be picked up the next week.
