## Fire Department News

The City of Delafield Fire Department is comprised of five full-time and approximately 30 paid-on-call personnel. The full-time employees consist of a Fire Chief, two Division Chiefs, a Captain, and one firefighter. All of the full-time employees are at the paramedic level.

The fire department provides a vast array of services including emergency medical services (EMS), fire suppression, dive/ice rescue, motor vehicle extrication, paramedic intercept, paramedic inter-facility transfers, fire & EMS public education, fire prevention inspections, and more.

The department operates from one station, which is located with City Hall at 500 Genesee Street. The Village of Nashotah contracts with the department for EMS (ambulance service). In 2000, the department acquired a third ambulance, which is housed in the Lake Country Fire Department in the Village of Nashotah.

On June 1, 2001, the fire department progressed to the paramedic level, which is the highest level of emergency medical services in Wisconsin. The fire department is only the third in Waukesha County to provide paramedic service after City of Brookfield and City of Waukesha, which are completely staffed with full-time personnel.

The fire department works closely with its surrounding neighbors. The department has automatic mutual aid with the Town of Delafield and Lake Country Fire Departments to all structure fires. This means that all three fire departments are dispatched simultaneously to all potential structure fires that occur in each of the respective municipalities. The purpose of the pact is to ensure adequate resources and faster response times to the fires.

The fire department is predominately comprised of paid-on-call personnel. Therefore, the department is always seeking individuals wanting to become firefighters and/or emergency medical technicians (EMTs). The fire department will provide all the necessary training and equipment. If you live in the area and want to get more information, please call the fire department.

In regards to myself, I was born and raised in Waukesha County and have been in the fire service for nearly 26 years. I have served as Fire Chief in the City of Antigo and the City of Baraboo prior to serving the last six years here in Delafield. My wife, Peggy, and I have three teenage daughters ranging from 15 to 19. Please feel free to tour the fire station and meet with our staff any time.

## Burning Regulations

1. Open Burning. Open burning is defined as a controlled, limited size open-area fire. Open burning in the City of Delafield is prohibited except as follows:
  - (a) **Who can burn.** Residents of the City of Delafield. Burning is prohibited on all business properties and construction sites.
  - (b) **Size of pile.** The size of the pile of material to be burned shall not exceed 4 feet by 4 feet by 3 feet high, unless authorized by the Fire Chief.
  - (c) **Location.**
    1. The pile of material being burned shall be at a distance of 50 feet from any structure, wood or lumber pile, wooden fence, trees or bushes, and provisions shall be made to prevent the fire from spreading to such items.
    2. The fire shall be contained in an approved burner located at least 25 feet from any structure, wood or lumber pile, wooden fence, tree or bush.
  - (d) **Material for burning.**
    1. Fuel for open burning shall consist of dry material only and shall not be ignited with flammable or combustible liquids.
    2. Material for open burning may not include rubbish, garbage, any material made of or coated with rubber, plastic, leather or petroleum based materials and may not contain any flammable or combustible liquids.
  - (e) **Supervision.** Open Burning shall be constantly attended and supervised by a competent person at least 16 years of age until such fire is extinguished. This person shall have fire extinguishing equipment available.
  - (f) **Time of burn.** Open burning shall be permitted only from 7 a.m. to one-half hour after sunset or as permitted by the City Fire Department.
  - (g) **Prohibitions.** Open burning shall be prohibited as follows:
    1. When the wind velocity exceeds 9 mph or local circumstances make the fire potentially hazardous. Local circumstances include, but are not limited to, thermal inversions, ozone alerts and very dry conditions.
    2. No open burning shall be permitted when the location of the pile and the wind velocity may cause smoke to create a nuisance for adjacent property owners. This prohibition shall apply regardless of the wind velocity.
    3. No burning shall take place within 25 feet of the high watermark of lakeshores, streams or other watercourses or in roadside ditches.
    4. Burning of standing or razed buildings. No building, structure, or materials from a razed building shall be burned, unless it shall be a fire for the practice and instruction of firepersons or the testing of firefighting equipment and shall be under the supervision of the Fire Department.



## Burning Regulations Cont'd

5. There shall be no burning on construction sites of any building materials
6. No burning shall be permitted on any day deemed by the State of Wisconsin as an "atmospheric alert" day.
  - (h) **Emergencies.** Whenever, because of extreme dryness or drought, the Fire Chief shall deem it necessary to prohibit the setting of fires upon any land within the City, the Chief shall by proclamation declare an emergency and cause to be published in the official newspaper a notice forbidding the setting of fires within the City. Any outstanding burning permit may be cancelled by the Fire Chief by written notice to the permit holder.
  - (i) **Permit required.** No permit is required.

Boaters must anchor or float a minimum of 1000 feet away from the island. All boats must have anchor lights displayed at all times.

## Spring Brush Pick-Up

Spring brush pick-up will begin on May 6, 2002.  
Fall brush pick-up will start on October 14, 2002.

The standards for the brush are the same as past years:

- 8' maximum length
- 6" maximum diameter
- Brush only (no garden materials)
- Stack perpendicular to the road in the ditch. Make

sure brush is not hanging into the street.

- Brush should not be put out until two weeks prior to the actual pick-up dates.

Wood chips are available for pick up at the Public Works Building or delivery by filling out a request form at City Hall. Three-yard loads are \$10 and six-yard loads are \$20.

## Lake Nagawicka Boating Regulations

- Speed limits: 45 mph outside buoyed areas, 10 mph ½ hour after sunset to ½ hour before sunrise.
- June, July, August: 25 mph Saturday, Sunday, and holidays between 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- 3 mph maximum speed limit (no wake) between buoys and shore within 300' from shore.
- It is recommended that all occupants of children and non-swimmers, wear an personal floatation device.
- Operators are responsible for having one approved life preserver per person aboard.
- In addition to the operator, water-skiers must have a qualified observer over 12 while skiing.
- Powerboat operation is prohibited within 100' of swimmers and diving flags.
- It is unlawful to operate a motorboat within 100 feet of any dock, raft, pier or buoyed restricted area at a speed in excess of "slow-no-wake".



# Cushing Park Road Bridge Over The Bark River

## PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL MEETING FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF CUSHING PARK ROAD BRIDGE OVER THE BARK RIVER

A Public Informational Meeting will be held at the Delafield City Hall to consider proposed improvements to the Cushing Park Road Bridge over the Bark River. The proposed improvements consist of reconstructing the bridge, Cushing Park Road North of W. Main Street, and Cushing Park parking lot. Anticipated construction will take place in 2003.

The **Public Informational Meeting** will be held on Thursday, **May 9, 2002 starting at 7:00 p.m.** at the Delafield City Hall, 500 Genesee Street, Delafield, Wisconsin 53018.

Representatives from the City of Delafield and Ayres Associates will be present to explain the proposed improvements, answer questions, and receive public input on the project.

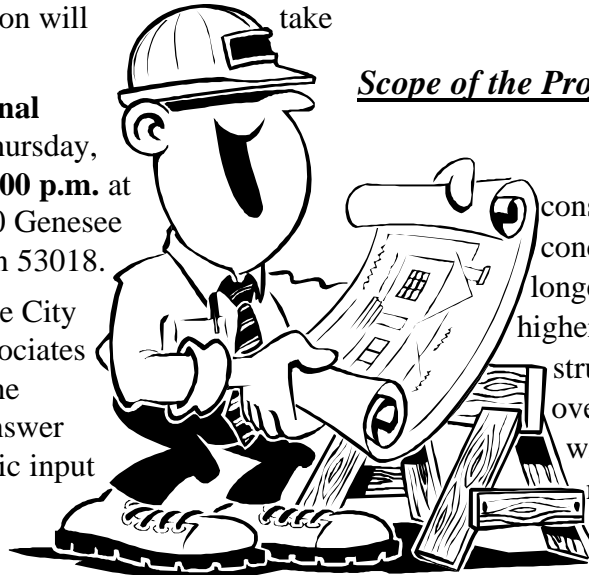
### Purpose of This Meeting

This public informational meeting is being presented in an open house format. The primary purpose is to provide you with information regarding the proposed replacement of the Cushing Park Road Bridge over the Bark River. Exhibits of the project

are posted around the room and technical staff is present to answer any questions you may have.

### Please feel free to:

- ✓ Examine all the exhibits
- ✓ Ask the staff questions
- ✓ Provide personal input on the project by speaking to a project representative or by filling out a public comment form.



### Scope of the Project

The proposed improvements consist of reconstructing the existing concrete flat slab bridge with a new longer and wider flat slab bridge with higher loading capacity. The bridge structure may also have a timber cover over the structure. Cushing Park Road will be improved by increasing the narrow roadway width to a twenty-foot wide, two-lane facility with an 8-foot combined bike and pedestrian path along the east lane of traffic.

The parking lot at Cushing Park will be reconfigured for approximately 25 to 30 parking stalls including two handicapped accessible stalls. Drainage along Cushing Park Road and at the

parking lot will be improved. The project will have no Right-of-Way acquisition but may require minimum temporary grading easements. The project will be constructed in the year 2003. Access to the park will be limited and the road will be limited to local traffic.

### **Purpose and Need for the Project**

The existing Cushing Park Road Bridge over the Bark River (Structure #P-67-786) is aged and has a bridge sufficiency rating of 25.1 out of a possible 100. The bridge capacity will be raised to the HS20 standard and the roadway improved to T2 Standards for Town Roads (roads with an average daily traffic less than 250 vehicles).

### **Who is affected?**

Local Residents with access to homes or apartments off of Cushing Park Road north of Main Street will have to navigate through the construction zone to access their property. Citizens of Delafield and visitors to the community will be inconvenienced by the limited access to Cushing Park during project construction.

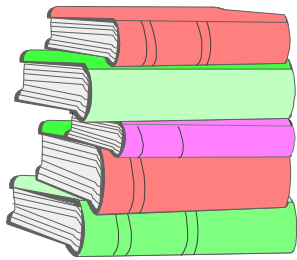

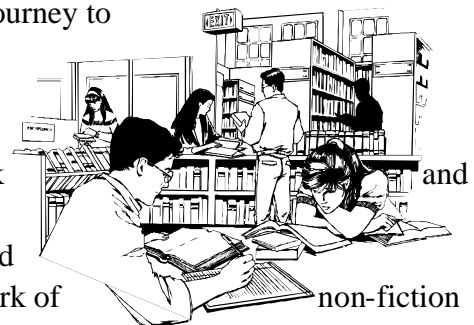
